New library series explores “What’s Next” for our city and the world

First program to discuss “Climate Change,” September 6, 7 p.m. at the Main Library



LOUISVILLE (August 20, 2012) – The modern world is changing fast. Now, a new library series takes an insightful look at the important issues just over the horizon. Called *What’s Next*, the series invites experts and explorers at the frontiers of change here in Louisville to share their perspectives on a range of topics, from energy to education, medicine to the arts.

If this year’s extreme weather and climate-study headlines have caught your attention, come hear Dr. Keith Mountain, professor and chair of the department of geography and geosciences at the University of Louisville. From shrinking ice to scorching summers, he has been engaged as a researcher in the science of climate change for over 30 years - his perspective shaped by his research in places as far away as Antarctica, Greenland, China, Africa and South America, and as close as Louisville’s Iroquois Park.
