Louisville, Ky. (April 11, 2011) – Just in time for Derby, a new exhibit has opened at the Main Library - *Arcaro to Shoemaker: A History of Derby Winning Jockeys* - showcasing artifacts, artwork, photos, and memorabilia from the [Kentucky Derby Museum](#) collection. Highlights include silks worn by Angel Cordero Jr. aboard Cannonade (1974) and Mike Smith aboard Giacomo (2005), a whip used by Kentucky-native and Derby winner Don Brumfield, select trophies from the Bill Shoemaker Collection, a sculpture of legendary African-American jockey Isaac Murphy created by Ed Hamilton, and original paintings from the Derby Museum collection.

Arcaro to Shoemaker is on display through May 25 in the Main Library's Bernheim Gallery, 301 York Street. The exhibit is free and open to the public during regular library hours. For more information visit [LFPL.org](#) or call 574-1611.
