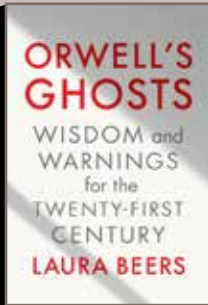

Historic Parkland Library reopens after nearly 40 years

The Parkland neighborhood once again has a library to call its own! Located at the corner of 28th St. and Virginia Ave., Parkland Library is one of Louisville's original nine libraries. Opened in 1908, it was closed in 1986 due to budget cuts. However, thanks to strong community advocacy, along with capital investment from Mayor Greenberg, former Mayor Fischer, and Metro Government, and donor support from the Library Foundation, Parkland Library is now open and ready to

serve the community. The newly renovated and expanded Parkland Library includes a full array of library services, including books and materials, computers and printing services, public meeting rooms, a modern makerspace, and free programming for all ages.

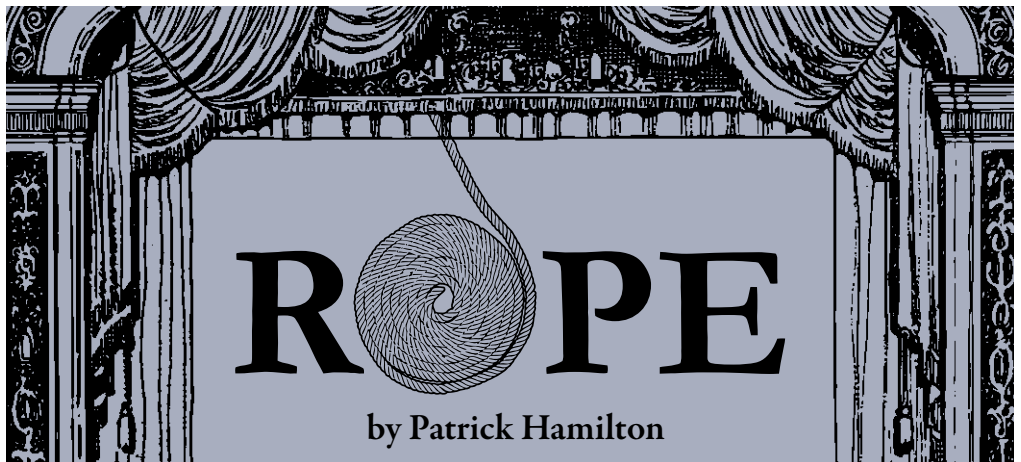


Living Well: Philosophy for Everyday Life

First up on April 6 at 1:30 p.m. is the play *Rope*, written by Patrick Hamilton in 1929. Inspired by the real-life murder of 14 year old Bobby Franks in 1924, the play tells the tale of two young men who believe they have pulled off the perfect crime – but can they get away with it? Hitchcock adapted this play for the screen in his 1948 thriller of the same name starring Jimmy Stewart.



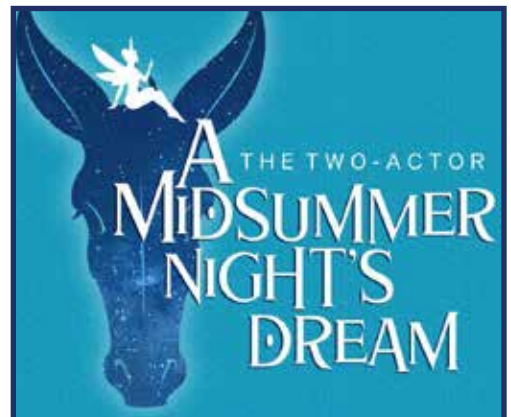
